Si está en el trabajo, pregunte al agente si está libre para salir y si el agente dice que sí, váyase. Usted tiene derecho de hablar con un abogado.

No firme nada sin hablar con un abogado.

Entregue esta tarjeta al agente. No abra la puerta.

If you encounter an Immigration and Customs Enforcement officer at any Los Angeles Community College District location:

D0:

- Tear off the attached card and hand it to the officer
- Inform the agent(s) that the LASD has been contacted
- · Remain calm and professional

Engage in casual conversation with the immigration officer
