do I get accepted to the collaborative?


First you must be accepted into an ADN program at one of the participating Community Colleges. Once accepted, be sure to tell your CC counselor you are interested in being a part of the collaborative. You must be eligible for admission into CSUN and complete the CSU Mentor application by November 30th and have completed all of the pre-requisites by the start of classes.



what

is the ADN-BSN collaborative?

The ADN-BSN Collaborative Program is a collaborative model for academic progression in Nursing that links CSUN with designated CA Community College (CC) partners. This collaborative enables the ADN student to earn a BSN degree in just over 2 1/2 years from starting the program. This enables the Nursing program to significantly increase access and capacity to advance more BSN-prepared RNs into the nursing workforce.

Requirements for ADN-BSN Collaborative (in addition to CC ADN requirements):

This is a collaborative, dual enrollment program between community college partners and CSUN. Students must be enrolled in the ADN program at the community college and successfully complete the first and/or second semesters in the ADN program before starting the first CSUN summer session. Students without a previous BA/BS degree will need to take Upper Division GE courses throughout the program in order to graduate with their BSN. Successful collaborative students maintain a reserved space in their cohort throughout the BSN program.

Students will start courses at their respective CC and take classes begin taking BSN courses in the summer. After completing ADN courses, students will transition to CSUN for the final semesters

Is financial aid available for this program?

For the first two summer semesters at CSUN, students may be eligible for private educational loans from a bank or other lender due to CSUN not being your home campus. Federal student loans and grants may be available when students are fully matriculated at CSUN at the start of the third CSUN semester, depending on each student's submitted FAFSA information.
