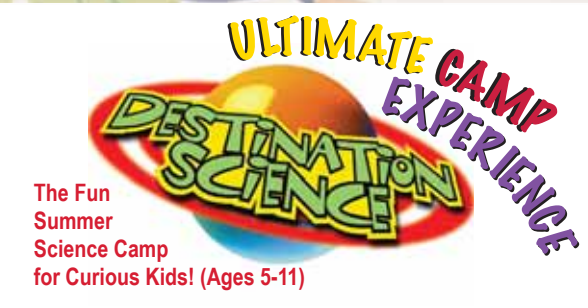

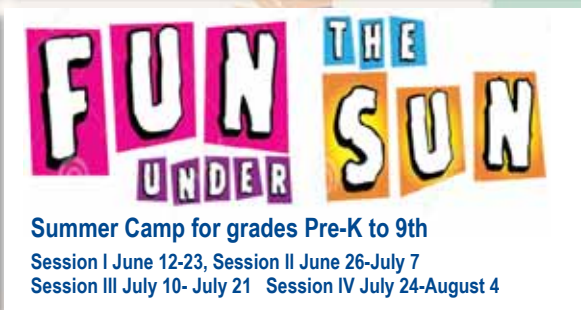

VIRTUAL RENEWAL CLASSES FOSTER AND KINSHIP CARE EDUCATION

Foster and Kinship Care Education (FKCE) classes provide quality education and support opportunities for caregivers of children and youth in out-of-home care enabling these providers to meet the educational, emotional, behavioral and developmental needs of the children in their care. FKCE classes are open to all Resource Parents (foster parents, relative caregivers, non-relative family member) and anyone else who is interested in or who works with children care.

Resource Parents Include:

- People who care for non-relative children in out-of-home care. Also, known as **Foster Parents**.
- People who care for their relative children, such as grandparents, uncles/aunts, older siblings. Also known as **Relative Caregivers**
- People who may not be related, but care for children of close friends of the family. Also known as **Non-Relative Family Members**.

Interested Parties may be teachers, day care providers, medical or emergency professionals, potential foster parents, child development majors, or anyone who is interested in foster children, children or care issues.

All classes are FREE
Classes qualify for SCI training and renewal hours

FKCE classes satisfy annual renewal hours for Los Angeles County Resource Parents (Foster Parents) that are licensed by the State of California. The rates and required hours are:

SPECIAL CARE INCREMENT TRAINING

The Special Care Increment (SCI) training was developed by the Foster and Kinship Care Education (FKCE) Programs in Los Angeles County in collaboration with the Los Angeles County Department of Children and Family Services and the Alliance for Children's Rights. The SCI training is designed for resource parents caring for children/youth and non-minor dependents in the Child welfare system. The course cannot be delivered to anyone under the age of 18 or audience that is not approved under the FKCE program. The SCI course may only be delivered to Los Angeles County Resource parents or those resource parents caring for Los Angeles County Children in the child welfare system from Los Angeles County (unless prohibited by CCCCO guidelines). To receive a certificate for class hours in full, participants must arrive by the start of class. Students entering 15 minutes after class begins or leaving class before the end will not receive credit for attendance. Pre-registration is not required for renewal hour classes; however, pre-registration is required for pre-service classes.

FKCE is the only entity that can provide the SCI 12-hour training and this curriculum cannot be used by any entity outside of FKCE (i.e., a non-profit organization, Foster Family Agencies, STRTP or another outside agency or non-profit not mentioned other than FKCE)
Participants must complete the 12 hours SCI training at the same college to receive a certificate of completion

Renewal classes meet on Saturday's campus in the **VIRTUAL** unless otherwise specified
Children are not permitted at workshops.

This workshop will review the revisions to the categories of legal rights outlined for all children in care. Part two of the workshop will discuss the rights of and resources for caregivers to ensure they are protected and able to provide a trauma-informed environment for themselves and the children in their home. 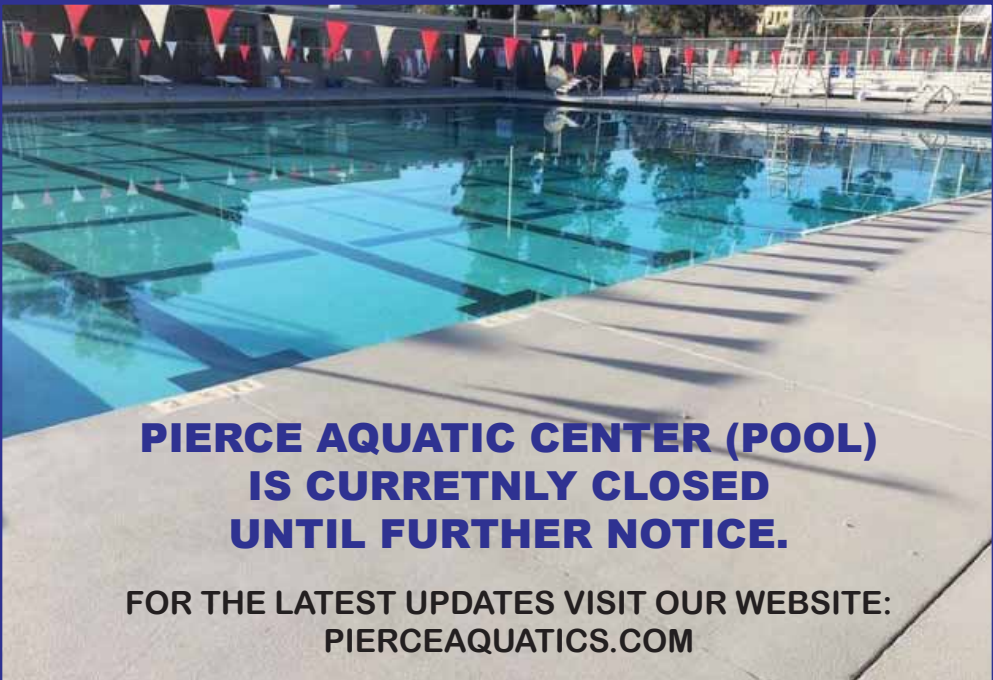
